
# May 29 Rev. Sharon Wylie "Prayers for Peace"

# "Songs My Mother Taught Me" - Spring Music Service

In 1880, Czech composer Antonín Dvořák penned the seven-song cycle *Gypsy Songs*. The fourth song in this cycle, "Songs My Mother Taught Me," inspires this year's Spring music service of the same name, which will take place on Mother's Day, May 8th. Dvořák's song says:

Songs my mother taught me, in the days long vanished;

Seldom from her eyelids were the teardrops banished.

Now I teach my children, each melodious measure.

Oft the tears are flowing, oft they flow from my memory's treasure.

On May 8<sup>th</sup>, the talented musicians of Chalice will pay tribute to mothers and grandmothers everywhere. We will also honor the role that music has played in our homes and families, as it is passed down from generation to generation. You will hear the Chancel Choir, the handchime ensemble, *Spirit of Chalice*, and several Chalice members who will be sharing the *songs their mothers taught them*. This service will surely tug at your heartstrings, and we hope it will remind all of us to keep music alive in our homes so that future generations will proudly present their own version of this service.

A young man discovers that his estranged father and a boa constrictor have been squatting in his grandmother's empty house. A lonely retiree new to Santa Fe becomes obsessed with her housekeeper.
