Chalice Construction Update

Construction continues apace. With the wallboard almost complete, the inside of the new building is beginning to look like real classrooms. On the outside, the concrete curbs have taken shape. The parking lot should be poured sometime in the next week or two. We finally have water back at the facility although the city has found new ways to charge us more money, so there were some unexpected fees. We will also be getting some refunds so it is not clear the total amount of the fees. As far as scheduling, there have been a few minor delays but we are really at the mercy of SDG&E right now. Power will be off at the facility for the next couple of weeks and the new schedule has

us back in the building at the beginning of August.

On a happier note, the landscaping has begun although it won't be noticeable until the planting which will happen after the concrete is poured for the parking lot.




Readers' Theater - Fourth Monday, July 22 at 6:45 pm

Minister's Message for July

As I'm writing this, I've just returned from Spokane, Washington a few days ago, where we held our 2019 General Assembly (GA) of the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations (UUA). This is our annual denominational business meeting and conference, filled with worship, workshops, lectures, and even shopping (yes, I bought a new stole). It was wonderful to be there with six Chalice members.

GA typically begins on a Wednesday and concludes on Sunday morning. What's less visible to our congregations is that ministers gather beforehand, beginning on Monday, for our annual "Ministry Days" event, a business meeting and conference for members of the Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association (UUMA). This event concludes on Wednesday afternoon with the Berry Street Address, which is open to the public (you can read more about this historical event at www.uuma.org/page/berrystreetabout).

The collegiality among ministers is one of the aspects of ministry that I treasure, and something that was invisible to me as a lay person (and was therefore an unexpected surprise as I entered the professional ministry). Being a minister is a unique calling, and ministers regularly gather together for sharing and caring in local groups (called "cluster gatherings"), regional groups (UUMA chapter meetings), online (cohort groups that meet via teleconference), and the Ministry Days annual meeting. We also gather for a continuing education conference every 2-3 years (called the UUMA Institute for the Learning Ministry).

It is a great pleasure to me to periodically run into Rev. Wendy Fish, who was the minister at Chalice Unitarian Universalist Church (one of our predecessor congregations) from 1995-1999. With Rev.

Jim Grant, who was the minister of the Unitarian Universalist Inland North County Fellowship at that time, Wendy helped guide the reuniting of the congregations to form Chalice as we know it today. (Jim Grant still lives locally, and I see him quite often at cluster minister gatherings.)

Though Wendy left Chalice 20 years ago, she of course continues to care about the health and vibrancy of the congregation, and is always glad to hear from me that things are going well. When I saw her at GA, she happened to ask about Es Gaunt, and I conveyed Wendy's best wishes to Es though Es's daughter, Kate. Kate reported that Es nodded when she heard Wendy's name.

It is so sweet to me to have this connection to a previous generation of ministers, and to serve as a conduit for connection between a congregant and a minister from decades ago.



So, I'm Alec Bergamini, the new president of your Chalice Board of Trustees. July is always an important month for Chalice's administration. We have a new Board of Trustees resulting from our Annual Congregational meeting in mid-June. This year July is especially significant in that it is, hopefully, our last month away from our Escondido home. Needless to say, excitement, anticipation and possi

A lot goes on behind the scenes as we transition from one congregational year to the next. For the Board, we hold the Annual Board retreat in late June. The retreat provides new Board members with an orientation on how Chalice governance works and allows us to set some goals for the year to come. The retreat was at our home in Poway and was facilitated by Rev. John Gibb Millspaugh. It involved 6 hours of hard work and a wonderful pot luck lunch. Not surprisingly, the discussions always seemed to center on, and come back to, the new campus (not just the building), and moving into the new campus. We covered a lot of ground, got trained, and came up with a set of exciting, fun, goals for the year. I feel like we all left the Board retreat energized and excited about what's to come and especially our new set of Board goals.

Here's what your Board of Trustees hopes to accomplish for 2019-2020:

- Find new sources of funds and creative ideas for fundraising in and out of Chalice including (specifically) raising \$50k for the Spirit Level Foundation grant and reserves restoration.
- Celebrate the "New Chalice" and Chalice's 20th anniversary within and beyond our congregation.
- Encourage the congregation in discussions about Chalice's Mission.

The first goal recognizes the fact that Chalice just got bigger. The addition of the new building has, of course, increased annual operating expenses (utilities, insurance, maintenance, etc.). On top of that, we need to figure out how to give staff cost of living raises, something that we've not done for two years. This all boils down to exploring new sources of income.

Successful congregations typically look for income from both inside the congregation and from the outside community. We have mostly focused on internal funding (pledges and the auction event), but fundraising from the local community has been minimal.

Monthly Challenge Question for Readers: Imagine a fundraiser that will raise money for Chalice, comport with our mission and Seven UU principles, provide some outreach, be positively viewed by the community and be fun. Think modern version of the old-fashioned church fair. Please send suggestions to ChaliceBoard@o2a.com.

Chalice Board of Trustees Report June Meeting for July Newsletter

The Chalice Board of Trustees met for their regular monthly meeting at 7 pm on Tuesday, June 11, 2019 at President Marshall Fogel's house. New member Dorris Kingsbury was announced. Member resignations of Carol McAllister and Nancy Lewis were also announced. The Board viewed two videos on successful fundraising. An update on the Capital Funds Status and the schedule for the completion of the construction project was presented. The successful fund raising to support the Casas de Luz home building project was announced. The Board approved moving forward with an application to the Chalice Lighters Program for funds to increase the safety and security of the Chalice Campus. The Board discussed ways to raise funds to match the Spirit Level Foundation grant that has been awarded to Chalice for furnishing the new building and purchasing new playground equipment. President Marshall Fogel expressed appreciation to the four Board members whose terms are ending June 30, 2019.

Coordinating Team Report for June Board meeting

- Finalized name of the new building (aka "the Hub") to be announced at the congregational meeting.
- Made decisions about keypad locks, room identification, and signage for the Hub.
- Created a vision for the common room using round tables, and décor to create an additional climate controlled (and quieter) place for coffee during social hour.
- Considered levels of celebration of return to Miller. Decided which celebrations will require a task force.
- Discussed options for fund raising through groups and activities.
- Created additional CT goal for the coming year with review of the goals generated at the joint CT and Board retreat.

Your Social Justice and Service Team is THRILLED to report on the resounding success of the fundraising campaign for the Tijuana Casas de Luz homebuild project. Thanks to your incredibly generous donations, your promotion of our online Faithify campaign, and the donations we received through that crowdsourcing site, we raised \$8,068.84! This will cover the \$6,200 needed for building materials and will allow us to offer scholarships to anyone who requests one to cover the \$50 per volunteer builder fee for our overnight stay in Tijuana on October 26-27, 2019. Any amount left over after scholarships will be donated to Casas de Luz to support their projects. We still have a few volunteer builder slots available; talk to Kathy Zapata if you're interested in participating, or if you're already signed up and would like a scholarship. No building experience necessary, just willingness to spend two days outdoors working hard and learning with your Chalice friends and our Tijuana neighbors.

The Social Justice and Service Team met recently and, bolstered by the congregation's enthusiasm for the Casas de Luz project, is researching another big project for the fall. We were honestly astounded by our success with the Faithify crowdsourcing website and will be using that again. It allows you to easily share our fundraising efforts with your friends and family, and we were amazed and gratified at the positive responses we received. We are interested in a more local focus for our next project, perhaps something related to education, and would love your input. Please reach out with your ideas about this or any other social justice project to this year's Social Justice and Service Team Members Susan L. *[edited for public]*, Kathy Z *[edited for public]*, and Chris O *[edited for public]*. We also say "hasta luego," not "adios," to Deb Coon with deep gratitude for her wonderful contributions and years of service as she rotates off the Social Justice and Service Team and on to other adventures.
