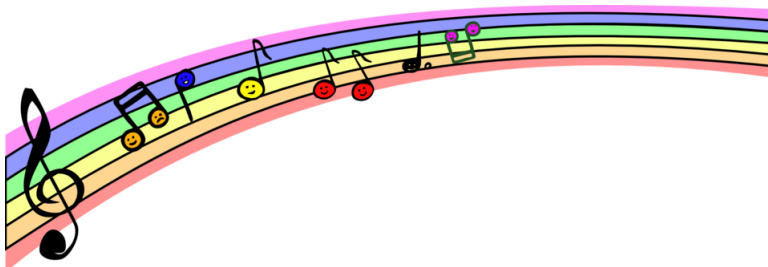
## Chalice Music T-Shirts on sale at the Winter Music Service on December 8!

## The Board Wants YOU and Your Leadership Skills!

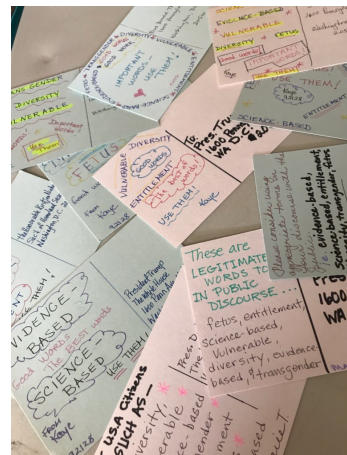

## *Minister's Message for December*

As we—finally! at long last!—get settled into our new space and continue to adjust to all the changes on our campus (we have a campus!), you will notice that we are paying fresh attention to the names of our rooms and buildings. This is because we now have new rooms and a new building, and we want the names of our spaces to make sense as we move forward.

For example, those of us who have been at Chalice a while probably know what I mean if I refer to “the back door” to the chapel or the kitchen. But when you think about it, those doors are actually closest to the street. To many people, those might naturally be thought of as the front doors! So we’re going to call them the “west entrance” (west entrance to the chapel, west entrance to the kitchen), while the other doors to those areas are the “main entrances”.

We’re also going to start calling the area outside those two west entrances “the patio.” Because it *is* a patio! If you haven’t been out there in a while, take a look. We’ve tidied it up, and there is now a table and chairs out there, as well as our new bike rack. It’s wonderful to have that be a more useable space (it was previously mainly used for storage).

Calling that area “the patio” will probably be the most confusing change, initially, because what we now call “the courtyard” *used to be* called “the patio.” But the courtyard really is a courtyard now that it’s bigger, and the patio really is appropriately called a patio.

That room we used to have most of our meetings in, that we called the Common Room? Now we’re going to call it the Fireside Lounge. There’s almost no reason for anyone to have a meeting in there anymore, and now that we don’t have to use it as childcare space on Sunday mornings, it’s tidied up and you can see the fireplace! (I know some of you didn’t even know there was a fireplace there.) Coordinating Team will figure out what the seating in there should be over the next few months. It’s a great

place for some quieter conversation on Sunday morning, especially if the courtyard feels a little overwhelming.

We’re calling what most of us think of as our main building “the Fellowship Building.” So our main kitchen is in the Fellowship Building, and the kitchenette is in the Hub. Naming it the Fellowship Building will make even more sense in the future, when our chapel eventually becomes our Fellowship Hall.

Are you still with me!?!

And at last, as you know, we have the Hub. The full name is the Idell & Nelson Discovery Hub. Sometime in the spring, when we have our new playground installed, we’ll have a special dedication ceremony for the building, and we’ll have a plaque that hangs outside the main door at the Hub porch. This is what the plaque will say: Welcome to the Idell & Nelson Discovery Hub, dedicated in honor of Jim Idell, Chair of the Capital Campaign, and Bob Nelson, Chair of the Renovation Committee, for the countless hours each volunteered in service to Chalice Unitarian Universalist Congregation and our dream of a better world for our children and generations to come.

## *President's Message for December 2019 - Alec Bergamini*

First off, the **Strong Finish Campaign** was a success – **thank you all** for your support. The work on new playground is now in the hands of the **Coordinating Team** and Family Ministries. Read on.

I've recently had a surprising number of conversations with congregants about how things work at Chalice. Mostly these conversations result in my directing the questioner to someone on Chalice's staff, or one of the support volunteers on the Coordinating Team (C.T.). Additionally, since these articles on personal mission development will eventually lead to talk about Chalice's mission statement, it seems like a pause to go over our governance structure and how we got here is in order.

The information that follows is all on the [Chalice Wiki](#) in more detail but scattered across multiple documents. This is the "Cliff Notes" version. Sorry in advance if this is a bit dry. I'll try to be brief. Here's the relevant timeline.

In June 2008 we adopted our current Mission Statement – "Open hearts, open minds, open doors, nurturing spirits and seeking justice within the wider world." At that time, we operated under a "pastoral" form of governance where the Board of Trustees handled detailed decision-making related to the running of Chalice, and the called minister followed the Board's direction on business matters and was responsible for the congregation's spiritual health.

At that time, we were already aware that our congregation had outgrown the pastoral structure. Specifically, the day-to-day running of Chalice business had outgrown the Board's ability to reasonably handle the details at once a month Board meetings.

Briefly, under Policy Governance, the Congregation hires/calls the minister and elects the Board. The Board releases control of the day-to-day details of running

of the church to the minister and her staff and volunteers. The Board makes policy, plans for the future, and oversees the Minister and staff's performance and budget. That is to say, the Board plans and the Minister/Staff implements.

A Governance Task Force was formed in 2010 as part of a [five year plan](#) approved by the Congregation in 2009. This Task Force presented its recommendations to the Congregation at the [June 2011 Meeting](#), and the Policy Governance structure was approved by the Congregation at that annual meeting. Implementation continues to this day.

## Chalice Board of Trustees Report for December Newsletter

The Chalice Board of Trustees met for the regular monthly meeting on November 12, 2019 in the Blue Room of the HUB. Board President Alec Bergamini made a Board development presentation concerning an annual Board Process diagramed in the book Governance and Ministry: Rethinking Board Leadership by Dan Hotchkiss. It was announced that a Financial Task Force has been formed to review the previous two years of the Chalice financial records as required in the Bylaws.
