MINISTER'S MESSAGE

This past September, I added a component called "land acknowledgment" to our Sunday worship. The words I use have been evolving; these are the words I have used most recently:

We begin our service by acknowledging that wherever each of us is watching, if we are in what is now called the United States, then we are on land stolen from indigenous peoples.

Our congregational home in what is now called Escondido is on land that is part of the traditional territories of the 12 bands of the Kumeyaay Nation and the 7 bands of the Payómkawichum, also called Luiseño.

Land that is sacred to us now was stolen from people for whom that land is also sacred.

In recognition that we are the beneficiaries of a history of colonialism, we have made financial donations in the past year to two local, indigenous-led organizations: California Indian Legal Services and the Kumeyaay Diegueno Land Conservancy. It is our hope at Chalice to find our way to right relationship with local tribes.

Sometimes I lead the land acknowledgment, and sometimes it is one of our congregants who has written their own words to mark this moment of the service.

For many of us, the commitment to acknowledging land was strengthened after attending the UUA General Assembly last year, which had a particular focus on the justice issues facing indigenous peoples.

Several of you have thanked me for the addition of this acknowledgment, noting that it has got you thinking in some new ways. I was glad to hear that, as I had no expectations beyond wanting to offer the land acknowledgment as a thoughtful practice.

One of you recently shared on Facebook the discovery of a great page there called "Native North American Indian - Old Photos" (@NNAIOP). The page features photographs sorted into albums by tribe, and we found albums for both the Kumeyaay and Luiseño peoples. The photos are wonderful to view, but even better is reading the comments of people who recognize relatives and neighbors.

I encourage you to spend some time there looking at photos. It is one way to start to get to know our neighbors a bit better.

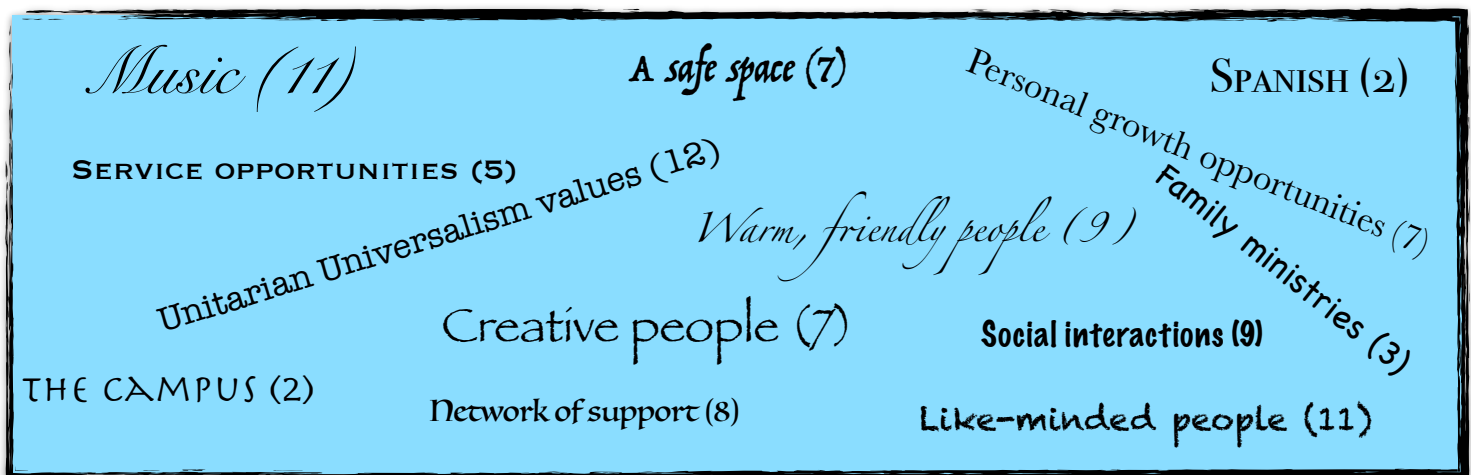
PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

"Community" has many different meanings. And these are all the ties that bind us together in these difficult times.

The first question at the recent round of focus groups in the beginning of December was, "Imagine you are talking to someone close to you about the ways Chalice is most meaningful to you. Describe what you would say."

A common theme was that people came to Chalice because of "community". The focus group format allowed us to drill down to understand what community means to different people.

Below is a list of the high-level reasons why people come to Chalice. The number following shows the number responses that were grouped into that specific category.



Unitarian Universalist values are important to our congregants. One person said (all quotes are paraphrased for confidentiality) that they come to Chalice for the "freedom of religion, and freedom of thought. I consider it the United Nations of Religions in that it is inclusive, and everyone has a place at the table". For some, Chalice provides, "a spiritual grounding that connects us" with "simple guidelines to promote harmonious relationships with my fellow man".

For others, the Chalice community provides a network of support in difficult times. For others, they focused on Chalice as "an inclusive place of accepting people".

Social interactions are also very important. The ability to interact with like-minded people outside of work, coffee hour, social events, and other activities help develop personal connections between us.

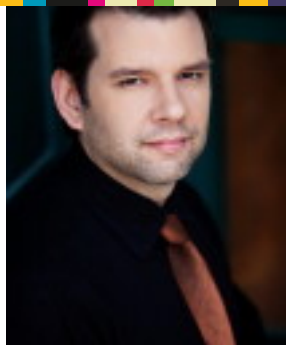

BOARD REPORT

The Chalice Board of Trustees met for the regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, January 12, 2021 at 7 PM on Zoom. A Board development video was presented concerning the partnership between the ministry and governance of a church organization. The Board heard a brief report on the status of the two small pieces of property that are for sale on Hamilton Lane and are currently under contract. It was announced that the Board and Coordinating Team joint planning meeting did take place over two days on Saturday, January 30 in the morning and on Sunday, January 31 in the afternoon by Zoom. The Open Question Task Force presented a report on the information gathered at the Focus Groups held in December 2020. They further reported that the final version of the Focus Group information will be presented at the joint planning meeting at the end of January. The Board was again reminded to read the fall Monitoring Reports before the joint planning meeting.

COORDINATING TEAM REPORT

Goal: Strengthen the ways in which congregants offer care and support to each other.

- Brainstormed different ways and group ideas to encourage cultivating our leaders and developing leadership qualities.
- Rev. Sharon is working with a congregant to launch a “get to know you” program for congregants to get to know each other better.

Goal: Increase financial support for Chalice’s operating budget, including pledging, congregation-wide fun(d)raising activities, and funding from outside the congregation.

- The Board of Trustees and the Coordinating Team met for their annual joint meeting to discuss and set the new year’s congregational goals.
 - Monitoring Reports and Focus Group results were used to help guide the goal setting.
- “Bingo and Beer” event, which is scheduled for May 7th, to help raise funds for the congregation and provide a safe and fun experience for our attendees.
- Stewardship team members are attending UUA series of stewardship webinars.

Oversight of Chalice programs and committees.

- Examined and deliberated different possible areas for the memorial wall.
- Various building and grounds repairs and maintenance are occurring while campus is empty.
- Due to pandemic, Aiden M. has revised his Eagle Scout project. Instead of building a gaga court, CT approved his proposal to create sanitizer and facemask stations.

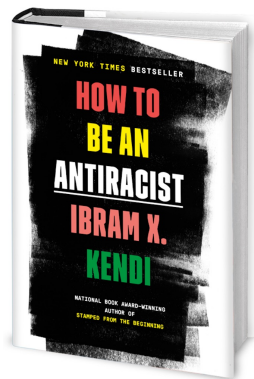
